Cranleigh maintained its strong academic results with 72 per cent of A Level grades at A*-B and an overall pass rate of 98.7 per cent. Forty-one per cent of A Level passes were in the A*/A category.

Nearly a quarter of all students gained A*/A in three or more subjects, with over a half gaining A*-B in all their subjects. Particular congratulations to Nat Lubbock and Christian Oldfield who achieved three A* graded A Levels.
