IVAN'S RESEARCH INTO RELATIVITY



Ivan S., Upper Sixth, has received the first Head's commendation of this academic year. Ivan is a keen student of Physics and spent the summer researching relativity, a topic outside the current A-Level syllabus. Having read the Oxford University Press 'Very Short Introductions' series, he decided to have a go at writing his own.

A member of Cubitt House, Ivan joined Cranleigh in the Summer term of the Lower Fifth, learning in his third language was a challenge, but his impressive work ethic meant that he was soon excelling in the sciences. Ivan, who also studies Chemistry, Maths and Further Maths is hoping to study Physics at Oxford University next year. The intellectual curiosity he has demonstrated this summer should stand him in very good stead.

CAMBRIDGE CHEMISTRY CHALLENGE

At the end of the Summer term, three of our current Upper Sixth students participated in an optional 90-minute Chemistry exam alongside 13,000 of the highest-achieving pupils across the UK. The Cambridge Chemistry Challenge is designed to stretch and challenge students with a keen interest in Chemistry, encouraging them to engage with the subject in a manner reflective of university-level study. This annual event, held in June, is set by a team of university chemists.

We are pleased to announce that Brandon G. has been awarded the Gold Award, placing in the top 11% of participants nationwide. Daisy B. received the Silver Award, while Christian C. earned the Copper Award. Congratulations to all three students on their impressive achievements!
