#### **RS ACADEMICS SURVEY**

Many thanks to all those parents and guardians who completed the survey of the school undertaken by RSAcademics in October. The aims were: to understand how satisfied families are with each area of school life; to find out what you most value about Cranleigh; and to investigate the areas in which you would like the school to develop and invest.

It will also give parents that do not wish to have their children vaccinated the assurance that, by completing a no consent, their preference is recorded.


