LOCKDOWN DRILLS

We wanted to make you aware that we are holding a dynamic lockdown drill next week. We will talk to the pupils in advance so they are aware of what will happen and what they need to do. In essence, this is simply to move inside a classroom, stay calm and await further instruction. The vast majority will already be inside when the alarm sounds and will simply be quiet and still. The specific actions and communications required are really down to staff.

We will explain that this is simply an emergency procedure for a whole range of possible scenarios other than fire. An example is that of a gas leak in Cranleigh village where the School has been advised to keep everyone inside. Conducting such drills is an important part of checking and refining our safety procedures. If you have any concerns, please contact your child's tutor in the first instance.

Boys captain Jamie T. swam a fantastic 26.40 for his fly leg of the 4x50 Medley, matching the times of the medal winning teams.

Hana A. and Siena R. swam brilliantly on their legs of the 4x50 Free at 30.38 and 30.79 respectively.

Overall, the girls ranked 22nd for the 4x50 Free and 17th for the 4x50 Medley, both in the small schools division. The boys ranked 15th in the 4x100 Free and 12th in the 4x50 Medley (just missing out on the final!) in the small schools division.


