VISIT FROM ENGLAND WOMEN'S CRICKET HEAD COACH, CHARLOTTE EDWARDS CBE

On Tuesday we were very lucky to be able to welcome the newly appointed England Women's Cricket Head Coach, Charlotte Edwards CBE, to join our 1st XI girls for their training session. Charlotte is one of England's most notable players and coaches, she represented her country over 300 times and captained the team for 10 years.

During her career she won the Ashes twice as a captain and led the team to a World Cup victory. Following her playing career, she has coached domestic teams across the world winning the Hundred, Women's Premier League in India and the Big Bash in Australia.





During the session Charlotte spent time with the batters, working on their technique and giving some individual feedback to help them to develop. Following a question and answer session she also presented the captain Abby S. with her 1st XI cricket colours.

Reflecting on the experience Abby said "it was an unbelievable experience for everyone - a once in a lifetime opportunity. Having followed women's cricket for a number of years the girls were all so excited to have a legend of the game in our midst and it was something we won't ever forget.

We are all hugely grateful to have been given the chance to learn from her."

Parents gathered on Saturday for the Upper Fifth Parent Carousel, an afternoon designed to offer practical advice and support ahead of their children's transition into the Sixth Form.

Hosted by Dr Andrea Saxel, Deputy Head and Designated Safeguarding Lead, the event featured an insightful "I Wish I Knew" panel. Upper Sixth parents shared their experiences and offered invaluable advice on a wide range of topics, including navigating festivals, parties, relationships, time management, and wellbeing. The discussion provided attending families with reassurance and practical strategies for supporting their children through the challenges and opportunities of Sixth Form life.

Following the panel, parents had the opportunity to attend one of three specialist workshops: Stress, Anxiety and the Nervous System; Risk-Taking Behaviours; and Cranleigh Life Coaching – What It Is and How It Works. Each session offered expert guidance aimed at equipping families with the tools to foster resilience, communication, and confidence in their children.

Chaired with energy and insight by OC Simon Broadhurst, the evening featured a dynamic panel of Old Cranleighans – Abigail Meaker, Bunmi Olaye, and Dylan Salamon – who shared their journeys as entrepreneurs. They spoke candidly about the highs and lows of entrepreneurship, the lessons learned along the way, and the realities of building businesses across different sectors.

Our students asked insightful questions about the advice the speakers would give their younger selves. The panellists' responses were both inspiring and practical: embrace every opportunity, believe in yourself, don't fear failure, and never underestimate the value of maths!

The event powerfully reinforced the importance of a future-focused education and cultivating an entrepreneurial mindset. It also highlighted the value of the CRAN.DO challenge, which students reflected on as a pivotal experience. Many also left with a stronger appreciation for the OC Society and the doors that networking within this community can open.

We hope this experience inspires our Lower Sixth to become advocates for the Futures curriculum, and that younger students are encouraged to seize similar opportunities to enrich their personal and professional development.
